One of it's most notable contributions was the sponsoring of the American Society for Horticultural Science which is now the largest and most effective group of horticultural scientists in the world. The National Apple Institute was also initiated by the American Pomological Society. Other activities include the organization of several State Horticultural Societies, spray residue research, new fruit and nut variety lists, variety appraisal, and formulation of a code of nomenclature as a guide for naming new varieties.

The organization has had its periods of feverish accomplishment, as well as its years of steady plodding. The consuming fire of progress must be balanced by periods of methodical consolidation if an enduring program is to be maintained.
