Yellow

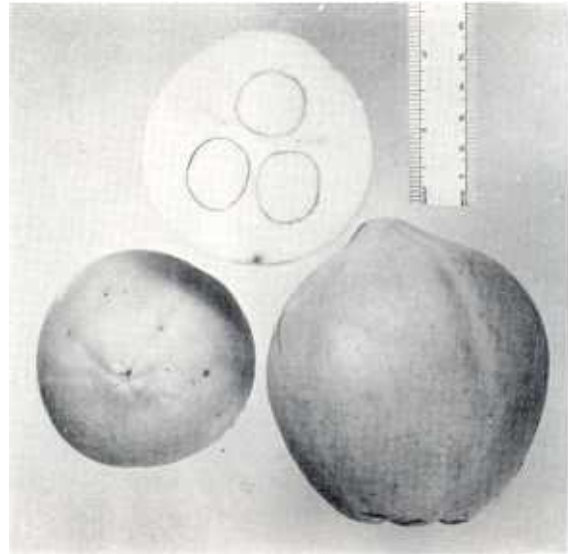
Fruit form oval with apex drawn to rather sharp point. Surface is characterized by longitudinal furrows extending from apex to base. Skin is yellow in color and rather tough. The fruit hangs well on the tree and keeps well after picking. The flavor is good.

Maltby

Fruit form globose with apex drawn to short blunt point and stem end gently tapered. Apex has faint longitudinal furrows extending to the tip and basal cavity marked by fine humps. Skin smooth, yellow-green in color, the flavor is good, but rather bitter. This variety, originally from Carlsbad, is a good bearer of large size fruits.

Max Golden

This is a tetrameria (wooly-leaved) type. Fruit form conical with very flat point. Apex somewhat depressed. Size

up to 4½ inches in length. Seed few, rather pointed. Skin moderately tough yellowish-green in color. Flavor is strong, somewhat bitter, especially when grown in cooler areas. This variety, which originated at Carlsbad, tends to set fruit with relatively few seed. It is not widely planted.
