## PECAN CULTURE AND GROVE MANAGEMENT

By Otis Woodward. 1949

Ga. Coastal Plain Expt. Sta. Cir. 15, 16 p.

This is a general-information type circular containing condensed but complete instructions for pecan production. The subject matter covered includes soil requirements, varieties, planting, culture and fertilization, insect and disease control, pruning, and harvesting.

### Varieties

Many of the well known commercial varieties such as Schley, Moneymaker, Success, Pabst, Mobile, Van Deman, Mahan Alley, and Delmas are so susceptible to scab that they no longer can be grown successfully in the more humid pecan areas, unless sprayed for disease control. Some of the varieties possessing high scab resistance are Stuart, Farley, Desirable, Brooks, Curtis, and Bradley. New plantings should consist primarily of these varieties.

A useful table is included which gives the percent kernel and annual yields of 32 varieties of pecans now growing in the trial grounds of the Georgia Coastal Plains Experiment Station.
