Mutsu Apple

The Mutsu apple is a Golden Delicious cross developed in Japan. Fruit closely resembles Golden Delicious, has a beautiful finish and has shown no russeting in the two years it has fruited at Storrs, Connecticut. It is excellent for processing.

Sonjana, a New Strawberry

Sonjana is the name of a new strawberry variety released in Germany, but for which a United States plant patent, number 1,691, was granted on March 18, 1958. It is the result of crossing Holstein and Sonja Horstmann. Reinhold Hummel of Stuttgart is the originator. It is everbearing, maturing between May 25 and October 15 at its place of origin, but is in its prime condition at the end of May. Since Sonjana produces vigorous runners which may be espaliered or trained on R. M. Brooks, Davis, California.

Tejon has just been commercially introduced by the California Citrus Experiment Station. It is a yellowfleshed, semi-clingstone peach which matures quite early in southern California. Dr. J. W. Lesley developed it from six crosses and one selfing involving a Peento hybrid, Columbiana, Strawberry, Rochester, and Early Imperial. It has a short winter-chilling requirement and therefore is suitable for warm-winter climates. It most nearly resembles Maygold.—R. M. Brooks, Davis, Cal.
