Varieties in Apple Collection at Pennsylvania State College

At the present time, there are quite a few old apple varieties in the orchards at State College, Pennsylvania. Some sections of land now occupied by these trees must be released for other purposes within the next few years. For this reason certain of the older varieties will be lost and are not to be included in new plantings.

The varieties which are listed in the accompanying table are now in production in the college orchards. In this table, the varieties marked with the figure 1, are to be abandoned within the next year or two. Those varieties marked with the figure 2, are to be abandoned but scion wood should be available for several more years.

In addition to the varieties listed below, the following apples will be maintained in the variety collection for a considerable period of years: Akin Red, Chenango Strawberry, Early Redbird, English Rambo, Ensee, Esopus Spitzenburg, Florence Crab, Lawner, Lowery, Mother, Muster, Niobe, Ohio Nonpareil, Red Rambo, Red Ribston, Roxbury Russet, Summer Pearmain, Sutton, Winter Banana, Yellow Belleflower.
