

## IT IS LATE ALREADY

No doubt many fruit growers have already ordered the trees and berry plants which they expect to set out next spring. If you have not arranged for the purchase of this material, it should be done immediately.

The most serious penalty suffered by the grower who waits until too late to order his trees is that the better varieties are sold out early. Therefore, the late customers must take the odds and ends of varieties remaining in the nursery. These left-over sorts may be of only mediocre value and result in an appreciable reduction in the profits which may be secured from the fruit growing enterprise.

As we have emphasized repeatedly, good varieties are the backbone of good horticulture. Consider carefully the fruits which you are to set out in a new planting and then place your order early. This will assist the nurseryman in delivering to you the varieties and sizes you prefer.
